COMPANION ANIMALS - LEAVE YOUR DOGS AT HOME

Council receives numerous complaints during summer about dogs being left in the back of utes or tied up outside stores on the street whilst owners drive along, park,

go shopping or have a coffee. Sometimes the owner will provide a little water, but nonetheless, that animal is suffering. No, the animal is not in a locked vehicle and will die in 4 minutes. **HOWEVER** the animal is on a hot ute flat bed, or surrounded by a hot metal cage in the back of a ute, or sometimes tied to a pole or tree in the sum on hot concrete. **THIS IS ANIMAL CRUELTY** –this animal will suffer for hours from heat stress. If a member of the public witnesses any incidents like this they are asked to report them to **POLICE** or **RSPCA – PROVIDE THE REGISTRATION NUMBER AND IF POSSIBLE SEND A PHOTO WITH YOUR COMPLAINT.**
