Be Water Wise this Summer!

As temperatures rise, Coonamble Shire Council urges residents to embrace waterwise habits to conserve our precious water resources and avoid potential restrictions this summer.

By working together, we can ensure our community thrives through the warmer months.

Tο use water sensibly, please:

- Water smart: Restrict watering gardens and lawns to between 7:00 PM and 7:00 AM to reduce evaporation
- Fix leaks fast: Regularly check taps, pipes, and irrigation systems for leaks and repair them promptly.

- Wash wisely: Clean vehicles on the lawn rather than the road or driveway to keep water use efficient.
- Run Full Loads: Only use washing machines and dishwashers with full loads to maximize water efficiency.
- Use a Broom, Not a Hose: Sweep driveways, paths, or patios instead of hosing them down to save liters of water.

By adopting these simple practices, we can all help conserve water and keep Coonamble Shire sustainable and water efficient.

Brain Campbell is a local artist that has always had a love for the Outback and has a big interest in preserving and illustrating the history of the bush, which is reflected in his work.

This display of memorabillia - medals, photographs and personal items - celebrates the courage, sacrifice, and enduring legacy, as well as offers a glimps into the lives of brave individuals from our close-knit rural community who served.

The centre also has a selection of merchandise, some of which is made by local talent here in the Coonamble Shire.

Mt Magometon Quarry

The Mt Magometon Quarry reopened on Tuesday 14 October 2025.

In respect of the Quarry operations going forward:

- Mobile crusher is scheduled to be onsite and operational during the week commencing 3rd November 2025
 - Crusher Plant
- o Scheduled recommencement at the end of the year is now expected to be earlier, perhaps a couple of weeks earlier.

Yarran Street

Request for Tenders are being prepared for the finalisation of the road and kerb & gutter, Stage 2 water and sewer and electrical and NBN works on the Yarran Street subdivision. This follows Council's receipt of the approvals for Electrical Design and NBN Design. It is hoped that the successful tenderer for the road and kerb & gutter works will be determine at the December Council Meeting to enable commencement of construction early in the new year

Core and Cluster

The development appication for the Core and Cluster project was approved by Council at the extraordinary meeting held on 17 October 2025. The development will consist of a core building that includes the main entry, reception, office, consulting rooms, storerooms, accessible toilet, multi-purpose room, communal kitchen, communal living

areas, staff accommodation and crisis room. The cluster will be made up of 6 accommodation units for temporary stays for people experiencing domestic violence. The facility will be fitted with CCTV, screening devices, alarms and panic buttons.

Youth Accommodation

Construction has officially started on the Youth Accommodation in Gulargambone and Coonamble. Construction is scheduled to be completed by the end of the year.
