Vote to increase councillor numbers lost

On March 27, 2018 Council held an Extraordinary Meeting to consider a request to increase councillor numbers from seven to nine.

At the meeting all Councillors had an opportunity to discuss the matter and put forward their views and those of the community who had spoken with them

Coonamble Shire Council General Manager, Rick Warren said, "the motion to increase councillor numbers was not successful with the vote being two Councillors for the increase and three against.

I must also correct the misinformation regarding the outcome that was published in the Coonamble Times on Wednesday April 4, 2018.

A motion needs a majority of

councillors at a properly constituted meeting to be in favour of the motion to be successful."

"Should Cr Karanough have been at the meeting and voted for the motion, resulting in a tied vote - this is still not a majority," Mr Warren added.

There is also a convention, while not mandated that the Mayoral vote is not used to change the status quo.

Council Meeting Snippets

Sponsorships

At the April meeting, Council again was generous with its financial assistance, committing \$1,000 to sponsor a race at the Coonamble Greyhound Racing Carnival on the October long weekend.

As part of Council's Sister City Relationship, Council has committed \$2,500 to the Campbelltown Arts Centre for sponsorship of the Sculpture Award which is held in conjunction with the Festival of Fisher's Ghost. Campbelltown City Council has recently provided \$3,000 sponsorship to the Coonamble Rodeo and Campdraft for their event on the June long weekend.

Crown Land Reform

Council has been advised that when the new Crown Land Reform legislation commences in 2018 it will introduce significant changes to the way councils manage Crown Lands under their control. Under the new Act dedicated or reserved Crown Lands will be "vested" in councils to manage the land as if it were public land under the Local Government Act 1993. Most of this land is expected to be classified as "community land" under the Local Government Act — which means that councils will be required to develop it

and have plans of management in place.

Although the new Act reduced the number of Acts councils have to comply with regarding management of Crown Land, it has increased the burden and associated compliance for councils.

SCC projects prioritized

With \$1.6m on offer under the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities (SCC) program, Council agreed to submit the following applications: Splash Pad and new starting blocks at Gulargambone swimming pool, upgrade to the irrigation system at Coonamble Sporting Oval, pool blanket and change room at the Coonamble swimming pool, basketball court at Gulargambone Youth Centre, playground/gym equipment for Gulargambone, skate bowl for Coonamble, playground shade across the shire, new public amenities for Coonamble business precinct, new visitor information centre in Smith Park, improvements to the infrastructure at Coonamble Children's Service and a refurbishment of public amenities across the Shire.

An outcome is expected in August.

Redundant Cattle Grids

Council is seeking community feedback from local landholders with redundant cattle grids on public roads. With this information, Council intend to undertake a removal and rehabilitation program.
