# Madame Flute performance rescheduled for December

The Madame Flute Concert is now scheduled to go ahead on Saturday, 4 December, following the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions.

The concert will be in a different format than originally planned for the winter event.

Those people who paid for tickets have been issued with refunds.

The new format will be a bring-your-own picnic and drinks event for friends and family on the grassed area near the Coonable Showground Pavilion.

Gates open at 6pm for a 7.30pm start.

Tickets are on sale at www.123tix.com.au at a cost of \$35 per person.

Jane Rutter performs regularly in Paris and around the world, at the Sydney Opera House, music festivals, theatres and cabaret venues.

The Australian Elizabethan Trust awarded Jane a fellowship grant that culminated in a DVD and soundtrack album, *An Australian In Paris*, which topped the Classical charts in Australia.

## Sportsground cricket pitch replaced

The cricket pitch in the centre of the Coonamble Sportsground is being replaced and the immediate surrounds levelled as part of ongoing project work under the Federal Government's Drought Communities Program.

The program has already funded new irrigation, lighting and grandstand renovations, with remaining work to include levelling, installation of irrigation and re-turfing of the north-west corner of the sportsground (near the corner of McCullough and Dubbo Streets), and replacement of the internal fence.

Total funding for the project, granted under the Drought Communities Program, was \$1 million, with a further \$59,000 co-contribution from Coonamble Shire Council.

### Levee upgrade and other infrastructure work progresses

Some property owners on the east side of Coonamble are receiving letters in relation to Stage 5 of the flood levee upgrade.

Letters have been sent regarding the creation of an easement for the levee and the compensation being offered to each property owner.

For those residents who have indicated agreement, another letter is being sent with the deed for each individual property. This is among the first steps in registering the easement for the levee on their property.

Public Works Advisory is managing this project on behalf of Council.

The levee, encircling Coonamble on its eastern side, is to reduce the likelihood of flooding of the town when waters from Warrena Creek and the Castlereagh River come together.

In other infrastructure work, Transport for NSW is preparing engineering designs for the intersection of Warren Road and the Castlereagh Highway.

For the major project of sealing of Tooraweena Road, the earthworks specifications have been derived with more accurate traffic numbers being used to calculate the depth of pavement required for optimal durability.

# Are you ready to choose nine community leaders?

Local Government elections will be held across NSW on 4 December, between 8am and 6pm.

Voters for the Coonamble Shire Council will be choosing nine Councillors for a shorter term (serving to September 2024), up from the seven Councillors of the current Council. The shorter term is to maintain the intended rhythm of the elections every four years—this current election having been postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Opportunity for public comment on draft policies and plans

Members of the public have the opportunity to comment on four draft policies and plans in the interests of open, transparent and participative local governance.

The draft documents on exhibition are:

- · Draft Drought Management Plan.
- · Draft Water Connection Policy.
- · Draft Backflow and Cross Connection Policy.
- Draft Evaluation of Menacing or Dangerous Dog Declarations Policy.

Council has recently adopted new guidelines from the Office of Local Government to exhibit draft documents for 28 days (four weeks), while allowing members of the public to make any submissions within this period and for a further two weeks afterwards (six weeks in total).

#### **Dought Management**

The purpose of the Drought Management Plan is to provide a framework to assist staff and our customers in the management of the water

supply during future droughts. This document is a requirement for Council's Integrated Water Cycle Management Strategy that is also currently in development.

#### **Water Connection**

The Water Connection Policy suggests a more systematic, consistent and transparent approach to the process of water connection to a property

#### **Backflow and Cross Connection**

The Backflow and Cross Connection Policy aims to ensure the safety and quality of Council's water supply through a consistent and transparent approach.

#### **Menacing Dogs**

The Evaluation of Menacing or Dangerous Dog Declarations Policy aims to give more clarity about roles, responsibilities, obligations and duty of care in relation to the declaration of a dog as menacing or dangerous.

### Disaster relief funding available for farming enterprises

Special Disaster Assistance Grants are available to primary producers to help pay for the costs of clean-up and reinstatement of primary production enterprises that have suffered direct damage as a result of the storm and flooding disaster of March 2021.

Authorities officially recognised the event as a natural disaster for Coonamble Local

Government Area last month. The maximum grant amount per affected property (subject to conditions), is \$75,000.

Funds of up to \$15,000 will be provided to eligible, approved applicants, without the need to provide invoices at the time of application. See further details on the Grant Opportunities page of Council's website.

## Plans to upgrade rail line to carry heavier trains



I have pleasure in reporting on my activities in the role of Mayor since the September meeting.

#### Rail upgrade

Cr Bill Fisher, the General Manager and I participated in a zoom meeting regarding the potential upgrade to

the Coonamble-Gilgandra rail line.

The upgrade will allow for heavier trains, connecting with the Inland Rail line at Curban, for freight from both Coonamble and Gilgandra.

#### Rural Fire Service meeting

I attended the local Rural Fire Service meeting at the Coonamble Fire Control Centre, where the upcoming 'fire-season' was one of the major topics on the agenda for discussion. Also on the agenda was the Community Protection Plan updates for both Gulargambone and Quambone.

#### **Welcome to Daniel Noble**

I would like to formally welcome Mr Daniel Noble to the position of Executive Leader Infrastructure, replacing recently retired Kookie Atkins. Daniel comes to Coonamble from the Gunnedah Shire Council. He brings with him extensive knowledge and experience from working at Gunnedah Shire and Tamworth Regional Councils.

Daniel is no stranger to the Central West, as he started his local government career with Warren Shire Council. Daniel's wife and three children will be joining him in Coonamble in the near future.

#### Vaccination Rates

Of the 2,444 eligible residents in the 2829 postcode area and the eligible 637 people in the 2828 postcode area of Gulargambone and district, in the order of 90% have received their first shot and 75% are fully vaccinated.

People are still welcome at the Coonamble Aboriginal Medical Service and Ochre Medical Centre for first or second-dose vaccinations
